Rain and wind didn't deter First Tee -Cleveland from hosting its 26th Annual Benefit at The Country Club in Pepper Pike on June 9. "We don't turn any child away," First Tee - Cleveland Executive Director Pat LoPresti said. "For us to do that, we need to raise money from events like this.
