Where Are They Now?

Weeks before starting medical school, Kate Hickey made time to give back to First Tee - Cleveland by playing in the 100 Hole Golf Marathon at Seneca Golf Course in Broadview Heights.

A native of Cleveland Heights, Hickey started First Tee when she was 8 years old. "The guys in my family played golf, but I didn't have much exposure to it until First Tee," she said. "First Tee did an incredible job of offering girls like me a low-stakes setting to learn golf. It stuck and made me more inclined to try other things."

In high school, Hickey transitioned into a more advanced role. She served as a coach and worked behind the scenes. In college at Ohio State, where she majored in biochemistry and minored in economics, Hickey returned to First Tee as an Alumni Intern. "I was challenged to think about lesson plans and how to design activities to best engage the kids. I was astounded by how much thought and prep goes into everything, from the handshakes to golf skills that run parallel to life skills."

Hickey, who started med school at Ohio University in August, remains inspired by the organization's mission. "First Tee taught me so much," she said. "I was surrounded by so many great people like Pat LoPresti, Brian McFarland, David Alexander, Dorothy Kasper, Mike Reiter, Mary Patton and Paula **Domzalski** who showed me how important it is to do something you're passionate about and something you believe in.
